



The Cross Road of Loving God



My current Easter message series is titled "Cross Roads". Every day of our lives we are faced with countless decisions, often beginning with the decision if we want to get of bed in the morning or just sleep in, then what to eat for breakfast, more and more decisions all day long!

Then there are times when we are faced with far more serious decisions to make, decisions that can be life changing regarding our health, finances, careers, and the most important decision, our salvation (our relationship with Jesus).

In February, I shared a message about loving God with all our hearts. **"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:4-5).** In Hebrew, this is known as the *Shema*, taken from the first word of the verse "hear". *Shema* also means to obey and take action. **So, to hear God is to obey God—and to obey God is to hear God.** Jesus referred to this as the "greatest commandment in the Law (Matthew 22:36-37).

This command seems to be impossible to obey. That's because, in the natural state of man, it is impossible. **With our sinful nature, none of us is capable of loving God with *all* our heart, soul, and strength 24 hours a day. However, that doesn't mean we don't make our best effort to try to completely and continually love God in all we do.**

In Mark 9: 14-26, a boy is brought to Jesus who is demon possessed. The father of the boy said to Jesus, *"If you can do anything, help us!"*(vs 22). Jesus responded to the father, ***"IF I can? Everything is possible for him who believes"***(vs. 23).

Jesus continually reminded the religious Pharisees of that day of their inability to keep all the Laws of God, trying to help them see their great need of a Savior. We are in the same boat, it is humanly impossible to keep all the Laws of God, including loving God with all our heart, soul, and strength . . . but that doesn't mean we don't try. If a person wants to succeed in anything in life, they know the journey to success is full of both ups and downs. Success comes from perseverance through all things.



The decision to love God with all our heart, soul, and strength comes from perseverance through the ups and downs of life and our walk with Jesus. As Christians, our love and affection for God should grow more intense as time goes by. Certainly, young Christians, new in their faith, become aware of the love of God for them and their love for Him. **But it is through the witness of God's faithfulness during those times of struggles and trials, that a deep love for God grows and grows.** Over time, we witness His compassion, mercy, grace, and love for us, as well as His holiness, and His righteousness.

The PAW Packs Program provides supplemental food for weekends to families in the Big Spring School District who could use a little extra help. We are currently feeding between 65-70 children per week. The food is being picked up at the Neville First Church of God over the winter months on **Friday's from 10 - 12 am**. With the expanding number of families starting to participate, we are looking for new folks to be part of the PAW Packs Program. Please feel free to join us at our next meeting.

We ask for your continued prayers as we continue to provide food to the families during this difficult time and continue to grow our program.

11. Pray for our church council as they meet together, that each one will hear God's voice speaking to them of doing God's will that would have the greatest impact on salvation among our church people and the unsaved.
12. Pray for those who are in prison, that they will find Jesus. Pray especially for those around the world who are in prison because they are Christians. Pray for their strength, courage and that they will be released safely very soon.
13. Pray for those who are in danger. We don't need to know the reason, God does. Just pray for their safety.
14. Pray for our troops, wherever they may be, as well as their families waiting for them at home. Pray for their easy reentry to civilian life.
15. Is there any way we can ever thank Jesus enough for what He did for us on that cross? Words of thanks may help but giving Him our hearts and trying our best to live for Him speaks louder than words. We can't even begin to imagine the pain He went through for us.
16. Our country is becoming so divided and many are becoming violent. Pray that the voice of wisdom and truth will speak and people stop flying off the handle immediately when someone disagrees with their opinion.
17. **HE IS RISEN!!!!** Praise God for the absolute proof that Jesus is His Son, risen from the dead, so that we might also have eternal life with Him, if we just give our lives and hearts over and accept this greatest of gifts.
18. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family, that they will continue to be blessed as they lead our congregation. There is often spiritual opposition when you are preaching/speaking God's Word. Pray for continued boldness in the messages God sends through the.
19. Pray for the adults and middle age people of our church. If they are raising kids or grand kids, pray they will feel God's guidance and patience. If they are caring for other generations, pray they will feel God's patience and guidance.
20. Pray for those who take care of the ones who can't take care of themselves. It can really wear them down emotionally, as well as physically to want to make things better and not have the power to do so.
21. Praise God if you have the problem of which clothes to wear today. Many people in this world only have one outfit, and that one might be pretty ragged. What can we do to help them?
22. Praise God that He already has a big plan for your life. He does not force you to follow it, but you can be a huge blessing to so many others.
23. Pray for all the teenagers and young adults of our church, that they will find their place in God's plan for their life, working toward it no matter what the world says is good.
24. Praise God that He has given us the privilege to be able to read His Word for ourselves. With that honor comes the responsibility to study for ourselves that what we hear is truth, not taken out of context or just a random verse, but what is truly in line with the teachings of Christ.
25. Pray for the Eastern Regional Conference that is going on today and tomorrow at Doubling Gap camp. A special praise for Pastor Shawn and Pastor Kathryn who are being ordained and publicly licensed this evening. Pray their ministries will be blessed and have a great impact on others.
26. Praise God for allowing us to have similar characteristics, but also differences. Life would be pretty boring if we all had the same talents, gifts, traits. He loves us all.
27. Praise God for police, firefighters, EMTs, etc. all those who put themselves in the physical/emotional danger, never knowing what they will find at the scene. Praise God for their dedication. Pray for their safety.
