## The Ride of Your Life



Greetings church!

I have not ever, shall we say, been a daredevil. I prefer my feet planted firmly on the ground. I like to know certain outcomes and I have never enjoyed contests or games of chance. I like to know where I'm going (thank you maps and GPS). And I favor a recipe or a pattern until I know it by heart and can perform it from rote memory. Suffice it to say rollercoasters have NEVER appealed to me. I can think of other ways to make my stomach lurch, thank you very much. So it might shock you to know I was once on the Sidewinder Rollercoaster at Hershey Park. Peer pressure is a very real and present danger friends. I was in my early teens and was also dealing with my reputation at church. And that's how I found myself on the ride described as an aggressive thrill ride. It's description on the parks website uses such disturbing words as "boomerang", "upside down" and "loops". Folks I can't even get through the kiddie rollercoasters without great fear. This was my undoing. My flight through the air is still seared into my memory all these years later. I remember screaming and I also remember becoming acutely aware that screaming wasn't helping at all. I also remember my legs jumping on their own accord. I \*think\* I may have passed out, but my memory at that point is sketchy. You can draw your own conclusions. I have only experienced terror like that one other time. But that's a story for another day.

Sometimes God's plan for our lives can feel like a rollercoaster. We hear the promises He has for us from His word and we have no reason to not trust Him. We start out excited to see what He has for us, but as the ride picks up speed our excitement can turn into trepidation. What have I gotten myself into? I'm sure that was on the minds of the Israelites as Moses led them out of Egypt.

After the promise from God of rescue and a land of milk and honey, the Israelites experience what they probably thought was the hardest part: actually getting out of Egypt. It should be smooth sailing from here, right? Wrong!

The Israelites have barely seen the last vestiges of Egypt in their rearview mirrors before God decides to take them on a circuitous route through the wilderness, when there was a much more direct route available. This, of course, was for their own good. "God did not lead them along the main road that runs through Philistine territory, even though that was the shortest route to the Promised Land. God said, "If the people are faced with a battle, they might change their minds and return to Egypt." So God leads them in a roundabout way through the wilderness toward the Red Sea." Exodus 13:17-18. He leads them to the Red Sea where the people of Israel think the Lord has led them to die! But we all know God parts the sea, they walk through on dry ground and in the end the Egyptians take a bath and the Israelites never have to worry about being bothered by their old bullies again. However, that's not the last of their ups and downs. You'll have to read Exodus to learn the rest of the story. It's a good one, with lots of twists and turns.

The point is, the path God leads us on can seem scary at times. Sometimes it doesn't make sense. What in the world are you doing God? I don't understand! I have said that many times. But know that He is with us

It can be scary and uncertain at times and we are often left scratching our heads asking what He's doing. But! 11. Pray for Pastor Heidi Alan and their children as they take on this new challenge of pastoring at Mechanicsburg Church of God since their Pastor has moved on to Heaven, unexpectedly. There will be a lot of people there who are dealing with grief. Please pray for wisdom and courage as it is needed to lead these people through this time.
12. Praise God that He is always there, just waiting for us to come to Him with open arms. How often we must disappoint Him when we ignore Him.
13. Pray for those dealing with chronic fatigue - who never seem to feel rested and feel they just can't keep going. Pray they will be able to get the rest they need and sense God's strength carrying them through.

15. Pray for parents who are raising their children or in joint custody, that the kids will know they are loved and the parents will have calmness, strength and courage to continue to be good role models.

17. Pray for those who live in war torn countries. Just imagine the constant fear of being killed at any moment.
18. Pray for those feeling lonely or confused, that there will be someone who can help and they will feel serenity from Christ.
19. Praise God if you have gotten ANY good news in the last month. We hope and pray for good. How often do we give God the glory and the credit when we get the answer we want?
20. Pray for all those of our church, that each one will grow closer in their relationship with Jesus, to be excellent witnesses for Him. Pray for good health for each one, too.
21. Pray for those who desperately want a child, but are having a hard time conceiving. Pray for patience while they wait and a clear sign what the next step should be.
22. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family, that they will be covered by spiritual and physical blessings. Pray for the other pastors in our church and their families, too.
23. Pray for those who have fallen, that they will heal quickly. Also for those walking icy areas, that they will stay on their feet, held up by the angels.
