DO NOT FEAR!



What do you fear??? We live in a time when fear and anxiety fills our lives. Many times we find ourselves in a place of fear as we think about what might be waiting for us with every new day. Like Joseph in the Christmas story, we sometimes wonder what others think about us. We become anxious to find a place where we feel we belong and feel like we are **accepted. Maybe we are like Mary and sometimes fear "what God may ask us to do!"**

How often do we lie awake at night with fears about the many tasks and deadlines we are facing, or fears about our health situation or our financial struggles? The news is filled with natural disasters, more school shootings, sickness surrounds us, then there is political uprisings and so much more. Many things in life that cause us to fear.

We could get on our phones and do a Google search and find an abundance of cures to calm our fears. *Google has an answer for everything . . . it just might not be the best answers!*

God teaches us in the Bible, "Do Not Fear" over 360 times. He wants us to know He has things in His control.

Scriptures also teach us there is a spiritual realm of evil forces all around us, but the good news is, God has strength and power over those evil forces.

In 2 Kings of the Old Testament, we can read a story about the great prophet Elisha. The short version of the story is, the king of Syria went to war with the king of Israel, and Elisha kept interfering with the Syrian king's plans to attack by informing **Israel of his battle plans. When the Syrian king found out, he secretly plotted another attack that Elisha didn't know about.**

The Syrian king sent a great army with many horses and chariots to surround the city through the night. In the morning, **Elisha's servant came to him, terrified that the Syrian army had surrounded them. As cool as could be, Elisha told him to, "fear not". It was then that God opened the eyes of the servant to see into the spiritual world. All around them the mountains were filled with fortified armies, with horses and chariots of fire, prepared to attack, and to protect!**

We can't see into the spirit realm. We can't see the warrior angels who serve God fighting the evil ones. More than likely, the spiritual realm will remain invisible to us, but like the wind, the sound waves, and so many other things, just because we don't see them doesn't mean they're not there.

The encouraging words from 2 Timothy 1:17 says, **"For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but one of power, love, and sound judgment".**

As we all journey into 2022, let us walk (and live) with confidence, knowing we have more powers available to us than we could ever imagine and we have **God's assurance that we do not need to fear!**

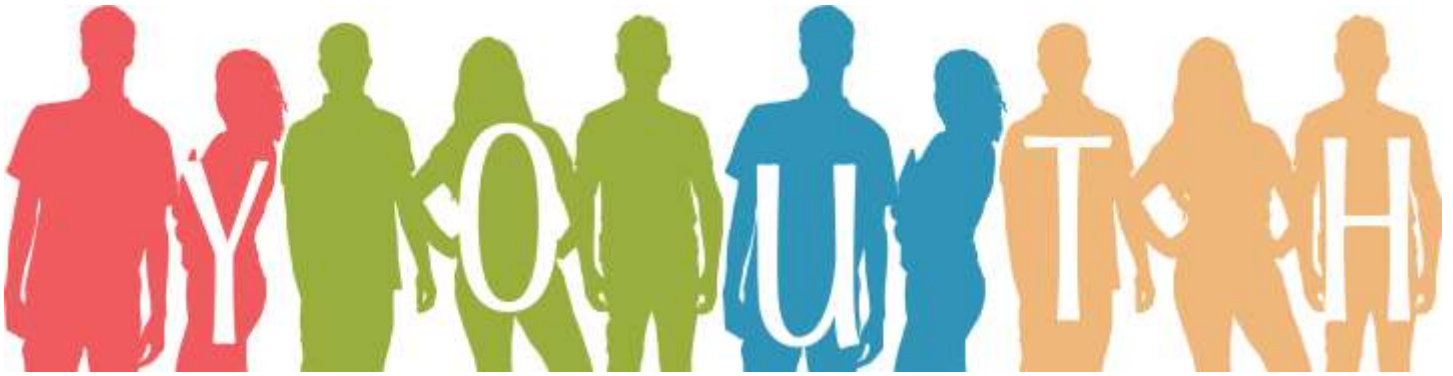

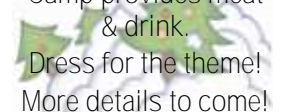
