Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:6-7 (NIV)

There are days when I look at our dog Cora and think, “you have such a laid back, easy life!” Basically it is eat, play, sleep, and it is mostly sleep. Nothing seems to bother her. Where ever Elaine or I go in the house, she will be at the feet of one of us or on our lap, or on a pillow . . . sleeping!



There is not much about life that makes her anxious or uptight, unless you forget to give her her much loved treats! How much better would life be if we all lived our lives that way? I don't mean sleep all the time, because we do have many scriptures to teach us that we are not to be lazy, but to **live life not being anxious about anything!** The Apostle Paul teaches us, “*in every situation present your requests, your needs, to God.*” How often do we adhere to the advice?

“**The battle begins in the mind.**” If we allow our minds to constantly focus on all the negativism around us, the conflicts in the world, health struggles, and so much more, we are doomed to be filled times of anxiety. **There are days when I would like to be able to turn off my mind and join Cora on the porch, soaking up the sunshine seemingly without a care in the world!**



When I allow Satan to fill my mind with negative thoughts, I have to pause and think about all those who are struggling with so much more in life than I struggle with. I know there are many dealing with broken relationships, major health problems, financial struggles and so much more. Many who are feeling they are at the bottom of the pit and they don't see any way out!

The Apostle Paul experienced some very difficult circumstances (health, prison, shipwrecked, persecution) in his life, and through those circumstances, he learned to be content with whatever trials he faced . . . and he learned to rise above the circumstances he faced. Paul learned that the battle was often in his mind, and if he set his mind on things that are praiseworthy, he would not only be okay, but that he would be able to encourage others as well.

Many times Paul was in prison when he wrote his letters to the churches, and **his letters were not about “woe is me”, but instead he wrote letters of encouragement, reminding those he was writing to about how good God is and how much he cared about them!**

Paul teaches us to have the mind of Christ and gives us advice on how to go about achieving this. I would encourage you to read his letters in the Bible, especially the letters found in the books of Ephesians, Philippians and Colossians.

We are currently feeding between 65-70 children per week. The food is being picked up at the Neville First Church of God over the winter months on **Friday's from 10 - 12 am**. Look at what Paul continues to write in Philippians 4.

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable — if anything is excellent or praiseworthy — think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen I n me — put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you. (Philippians 4:8–9, NIV)

What circumstances in life are filling you with anxiety? I want to encourage you to turn them over to Jesus. Jesus tells us to, *“Cast your cares upon me, and I will give your rest.” (Matthew 11:28)*. Jesus also told his disciples, *“My peace I give you, not as the world gives, let not your heart be troubled.” (John 14:27 paraphrased)*.

In closing, **if you are struggling with some anxieties in life that seem overwhelming**, I encourage you to take a note card and write out the words of Philippians 4:4-9 and verse 13. Keep it in your pocket and **several times a day, take your burdens to Jesus in prayer, and read those verses to remind yourself to rejoice in the Lord and think upon the good things He has and will continue to do for you.** It may not take all your problems away . . . but it will sure help you to take the time to clear your mind for a few moments and refresh yourself in the SONshine of Jesus! **And if you need someone to pray with you, be sure to give me a call!**
