#### LIFE CHOICES

In their book *Decisive*, Chip Heath and Dan Heath show through their extensive research that we are biologically hardwired to act foolishly and behave irrationally (basically, I would interpret that to be our sin nature we are born with, see Psalms 51:12, John 3:3-7, Romans 5:12). They explain that our emotions may be the preeminent enemy of excellent decisions as we allow emotions overrule logic.

Have you've experienced this? You don't want to yell at your children, but then they do something dumb. Logic says, Be patient, but emotion says, YELL as loudly as you can... emotion overrules logic! Or there's a sin you are determined to avoid. Temptation comes knocking. Logic says, Do what is God honoring. But emotion says, "Go ahead, it won't hurt you just this one time"... emotion overrules logic.

I've been sharing with you a sermon series, Life Choices. I wrote these messages using many points and illustrations from a book I read, "10 Choices, A Proven Plan to Change Your Life Forever" by Dr. James MacDonald. There are many challenging things that have spoken to me about making right, God honoring choices in my life. Sadly, I've not always made right choices! I would guess that many of you could say the same thing. Often, we wish we could sometimes go back and change the choices we made in the past, a choice that had significant impact on your life today!

Last week I began reading the introduction to a new book that I ordered, "Think Ahead, Seven Decisions You Can Make Today For The God Honoring Life You Want Tomorrow", by Pastor Craig Groeschel. In the pre-order information I was able to read:

To make great decisions we need to think ahead, to ask, "What are the consequences of this choice? What path does this decision put me on?" In our decision making process, do we make "logical" decisions or "emotional" decisions? We spend way too much time analyzing unimportant decisions (what do I want to watch on TV) but make important decisions on a whim (I feel like watching TV instead of doing my devotions).

Both the books, the one I read and the one I look forward to reading, take me into the Word of God, which is the primary book we all need to be reading. It is the Word of God that is useful for teaching....and for guidance in making wise choices (2 Timothy 3:16).

The Apostle Paul wrote about his frustrating battle in making wise choices. Romans 7:19: "I want to do what is good, but I don't. I don't want to do what is wrong, but I do it anyway" (NLT).

Can you say the same thing? When we think about former choices in life, the enemy will get you stuck thinking, "I've always been this way, always done these things...

I am what I am"! But God says, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing!" (Isa. 43:18–19).

I encourage you to make the choice today to partner with God to make faith based Life Choices. He wants to help you make new choices, right choices. As I shared with you in week one of my sermon series, the first choice we all need to make is to CHOOSE GOD! Why? Because scripture reminds us in Proverbs 16:3, "Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and he will establish your plans".

you make new choices, right choices. As I shared with you in week one of my sermon series, the first choice we all need to make is to CHOOSE GOD! Why? Because scripture reminds us

in Proverbs 16:3, "Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and he will establish your plans".

Decide now, what you will do later! Decide now, to make life choices ahead of time based on "logic" and not on the spur of the moment based on "emotions".

- ♦ Abraham choose to follow God long before God told him to sacrifice his son Isaac.
- ♦ Noah choose to trust God long before the rains came!
- Daniel choose to serve God many years before he was thrown in the lion's den.

I hope as you make choices in life, they won't be based just on logic, or emotions, but on the wisdom that comes from the Word of God. If you use the Bible to be your guidebook, you won't go wrong! How do I know that, because scripture says in Jeremiah 29:11, I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future".


James Clear, author of Atomic Habits wrote, "Every decision you make is a vote toward who you will become."

When the Israelites were faced with a choice to serve the gods of the land or the one true God, Joshua said:


As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord. Joshua 24:15



- 1. Pray for those who have or will soon lose their jobs. Pray they can find something else soon before they get into deep financial trouble.
- 2. Pray for the Paw Packs programs and others like it. Pray that food will still be readily available at affordable costs. Praise God for putting the specific people into place who run it, as well as those who donate, help to pack and distribute. It's a huge blessing to the givers and receivers.
- 3. Pray for those who deal with extreme fatigue. It can come from so many sources. But it's hard to function when you feel like you are too tired to function. Your prayers will help a lot.
- 4. Pray for those who have trouble sleeping for whatever reason. It is much easier to make smart choices in your life and for God when you are alert. Instead of counting sheep if you have trouble falling asleep, try talking to the Shepherd.
- 5. Praise God that even when we do have hard times, God is awake and ready when we call on Him. You will never get a busy signal. He wants YOU to talk to Him any time, day or night.
- 6. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family as well as all of the other Pastors in our church and their families. In these times, being a Christian can make people have a reaction, for good or not. Pray for their good health and well being as well as courage to continue preaching Biblical truth.
- 7. Pray for those who are paralyzed by disease or through an accident. Pray they will not cave into the bitterness that could seem "normal", but that they will come to rely on God for strength, comfort and healing.
- 8. Pray for our First Responders (Police, EMT's, firefighters, so many emergency workers). They deserve our prayers for protection as they put themselves in danger for the rest of us. Pray for total health.
- 9. Tonight is Daylight Savings Time. You will "lose" one hour. But praise God that you will readjust. Because He has made you like Him. You can do things because He gives you the strength. Thank Him for that!
- 10. Praise God for the beauty we will soon be seeing and the warmer temperatures we'll be feeling. Spring really is coming soon.
- 11. Pray for those who are involved in the Elders and Council meetings. There are always important decisions to be made for furthering Jesus' kingdom. Pray for wisdom to abound in the rooms where the meetings are held and thank Him for showing His will in past choices that were made.
- 12. Pray for those who are expecting to have surgery or have recently had it. Pray for healing and a calmness that passes understanding.
- 13. Praise God that He gives you chances to do nice things for others. Actually, He often uses you to bless them and puts you in that place at that specific time, to make a difference in both lives. Be brave just do it.
- 14. Pray that those who are moving to another area will have an easy time learning their way around and find new places to call home and friends.
- 15. Praise our Lord that we can still speak mostly freely. Many around the world don't have that privilege. Pray for those who are stifled in so many ways.
- 16. Pray for those who have large medical expenses and no insurance. It may make needed treatments impossible to get, or create a debt that is nearly impossible to pay off, so they can lose everything they own. Pray that things can get back to a reasonable circumstance.
- 17. Pray for those who are going into a nursing home for rehab or long term care. Pray they can do the work to get stronger and be back home, if possible. If not, pray that they will be able to get accustomed to their new surroundings and make friends to have a good life, even if it is different.
- 18. Praise God that occasionally He does not answer your prayers quite the way you hope for. He still answers, but sometimes He has a better plan that you don't always see from the present perspective. Hopefully, you can look back and see something in your life that became a huge unexpected joy.
- 19. Pray for world leaders, that they will honestly find Christ and give up the greed and hunger for power at the cost of their citizens. It appears to be world wide. We are told to pray for them, let it be for honesty and decency as well as good moral values to become their legacy.
- 20. Praise God for giving us a beautiful house of worship, but also the mindset to share it with other groups as an outreach. The fact that the scouts and other groups can use it can be a blessing for us all. Some people who might not be comfortable with church may be more relaxed coming in for other things.
- 21. Pray for those dealing with addictions. Whether it is gambling, drinking, or other things that take over our minds and time. Pray for clearer minds for these people. We all have something we are compulsive about.
- 22. Pray for those who are living in fear or having panic attacks. Pray they will be filled with the Holy Spirit, that as their faith increases, their fear will decrease to the point where they can live a life of love and peace.
- 23. Praise God that He does have many circumstances planned out for you. Sure, you have free will and choices. But He also knows the big picture and what will happen if you take a different fork in the road. Praise God that He was working on your plan before you were even born.
- 24. Pray for those who are becoming homeless for whatever reason. Pray they can find a place to stay, especially in this cold weather. We may not always see them, but there are many more than we know.
- 25. When Jesus went to Jerusalem, mostly everyone was excited and happy. Then they turned on Him. Do you remember when you became saved? Do you still have that joy? Pray for the reconnection with Christ that will give you peace and joy in your heart, even in harder times.

- 26. This coming Sunday there will likely be some people who will join us for worship who don't come often. Pray that the Holy Spirit will be presenting the message directly to their souls in a way they never felt before and they will choose to commit their hearts and lives to Christ.
- 27. Pray that those who are plotting evil and attacks will be stopped. Obviously, it is occurring so many places around the world. Pray that the devil's plans will be crushed.
- 28. Praise God if He has added friends and family in you life who encourage you in your Christian faith. It is wonderful to be able to have good clean fun with those you can just be yourself around. Do you know others who don't have this support system? Maybe you can start another circle of like minded people.
- 29. Would you be willing to give your life for someone you knew would disrespect you? Let alone an extremely gruesome and agonizing death? Praise Jesus Christ that His was willing to do that for YOU and for everyone else. It is a debt we can never repay. But He paid it all. He deserves our loyalty.
- 30. There are a lot of Easter egg hunts going on in the area. Pray that there will be some spiritual truths that get through to those who attend. That they may even choose to attend a worship service for Easter, or at the very least have a curiosity as to what it is all about.
- 31. Hallelujah? He is risen!!! Praise Jesus, He proved that He is God's Son. Worthy of our trust and praise.
